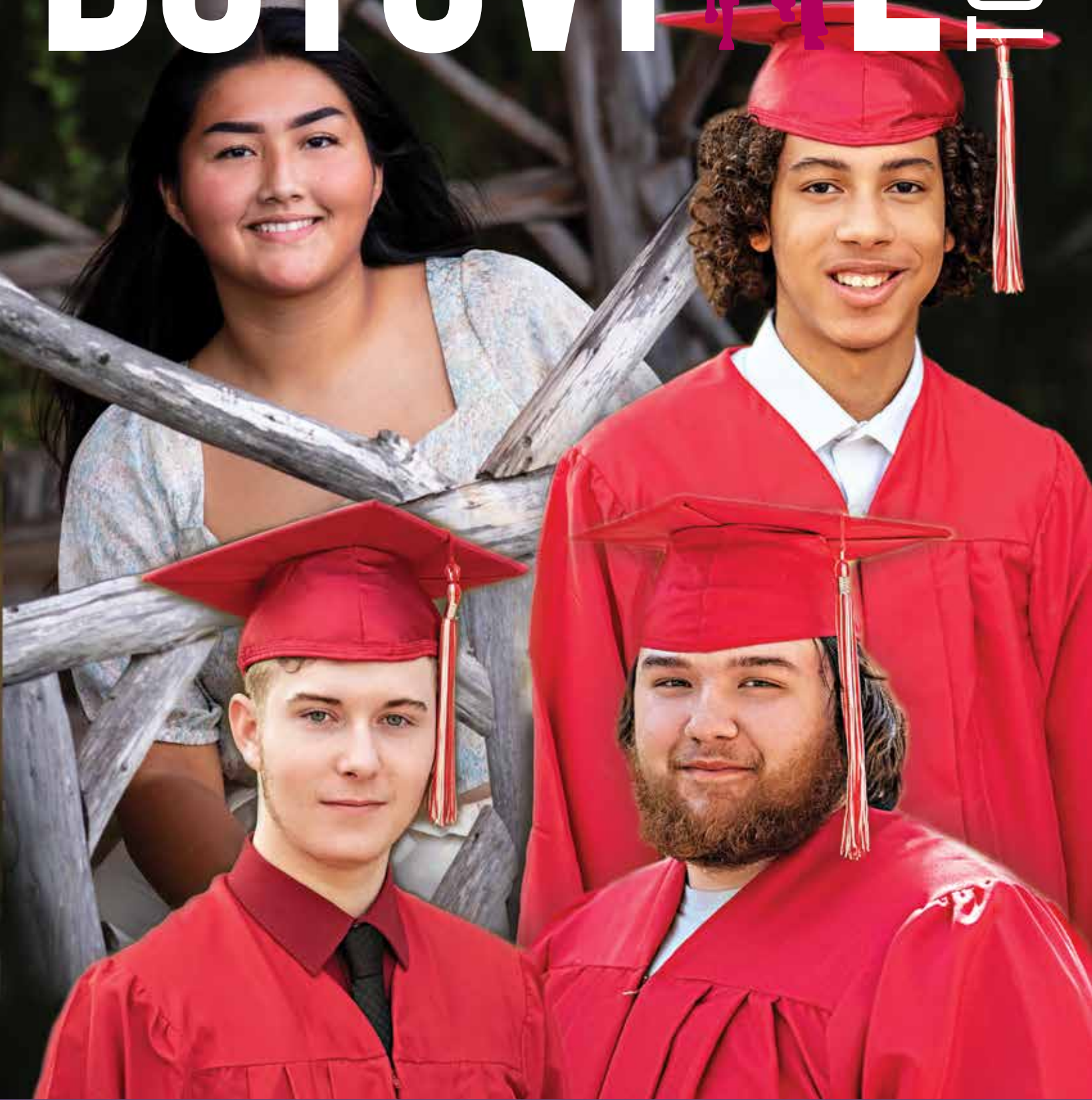

When a child arrives at Boysville, we immediately start working towards discharge. That may sound odd, but in reality, we are planning for their future. On average, a child will stay at Boysville for 18 months. Some will stay for a shorter amount of time and some (like many of our teenagers) will stay until they graduate. Whether a child is able to return home, move to a kinship placement or foster home, or graduate from high school, they leave with life skills that can move them along the path to success. Our goal is to make sure that each child leaves in a better state than how they arrived.

Robert is a prime example of reaching goals. Robert came to Boysville with his siblings several years ago. He lived in our residential program and graduated last year. His first year of college presented many challenges but with the coping and life skills he learned at Boysville along with support from our SIL program, he made the dean's list with a 3.82 GPA!

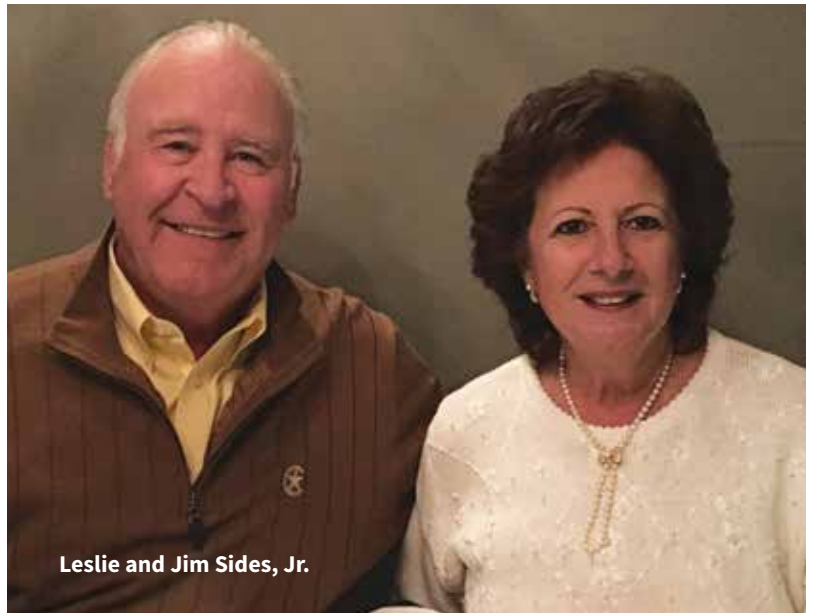

Many years after the loss of my 9-year-old son, I realized that there was no way to avoid the pain, but maybe I could provide some help and happiness through mentoring young people. While living in Arizona, I became a “Big Brother” because I believed that every child had the innate ability to succeed and prosper in life.

When we moved back to my native Texas and settled in the San Antonio area, I wanted to continue contributing to the lives of young people. I was having conversation with my builder and learned about Boysville. After several visits to the Boysville campus, I learned that the boys and girls there came from broken homes and abusive situations and were often neglected. At Boysville, they are provided with a safe, caring home and receive something many had never experienced:

- family engagement

- normal schooling
- exercise and sports opportunities
- physical health, dental, and optical care
- and a loving family atmosphere

Boysville proves that when a child grows up in a family environment, it gives them the opportunity to find better relationships, better communication and social skills, better preparation for school, and a real chance to become a responsible adult.

When I was invited to join the Board of Directors, I was honored and humbled that I could help make a difference in the children's lives through volunteering, donations, and annual gifts.

Boysville continues to be important to us and we want them to continue providing the necessities of life to the children of San Antonio who are entrusted to their care.
